#### The Journey from Despair to Hope in Cook County Jail

Greetings to you all in the strong name of Jesus!

I'm still here, continuing the work I've been doing for nearly 40 years, and I want to express my deep gratitude for your support and encouragement of CPO. Our 30th anniversary banquet in May was unforgettable, with over 600 attendees! Praise God for His abundant blessings!

I would like to share with you a brief narrative that I have asked a dear friend of mine to write about his experience while he was in Cook County Jail and after his release.

#### Have you ever climbed a mountain?

My life changed forever when I was arrested and placed in Cook County Jail.



At first, I thought I could handle it, but as my court dates dragged on, I realized I wouldn't be leaving anytime soon. I began to understand that incarceration wasn't just about confinement - it was about watching your life stand still while the world around you moved forward. During this time of despair, I met Dan Swets, a chaplain at Cook County Jail. What struck me most was his dedication - rain or shine, Dan was there to bring us the Word of God. After his visits, we would spend hours discussing the message he shared. Even when the deck was locked down due to violence, Dan still made the effort to visit. I remember one particularly tense day when, despite his difficulty walking, Dan climbed a flight of metal stairs to reach me. He prayed with me, answered my questions, and shared verses for the next day.

That simple gesture changed my life. For the first time, I didn't just hear about God - I truly learned about Him. I started to consider God's principles, and it transformed me.

When I was sentenced and transferred to another facility, Dan promised to visit wherever I ended up. I didn't expect him to follow through, but to my surprise, he found me and sent a letter. Dan kept his word, visiting me and encouraging me both as a man and in my faith.

After my release, Dan continued to stay in contact, helping me keep my focus on God through the challenges of life. He never sugarcoats things - he speaks truth straight from the Word of God.

Dan has been my mentor, brother, and friend. I truly believe that if I had a friend like Dan earlier in life, I might not have needed to endure the pain of incarceration to discover the Good News.

#### **Built To Last**

In the past nine years, I've had the privilege of meeting with hundreds of people who say they want to have a new life. But old habits and the call of old friends sometimes makes for a bumpy ride on the road to redemption. But there are signs of life too!

Part of what I do with CPO is coordinate the Letters of Hope ministry to people in the Illinois Department of Corrections. I send out a quarterly "Chaplains Letter" to those who I've encountered over the years at the jail. Here is a part of a note I received in response to a recent letter I sent out.

Tim writes, "It's been seven years since our visits at Cook County Jail. I have never responded to you. But you have never stopped reaching out or praying. I thank God for that. Along my journey God has looked out for me. God has kept me safe and built me into a man that I can say I'm proud to have become. Thanks, Chap, for never forgetting the ones in prison."

Pray with us for all the CPO staff and volunteers to stay faithful in our going, listening, speaking, praying and watching for God's Spirit to make new creations in Christ a reality in impossible situations.

# The Class of 2024

This year, the Outreach Career Centers at both our Roseland and Evanston campuses will hold **ten** cohorts of classes in welding, electrical and carpentry, hosting nearly **125** students! All of our vocational students come to us with a criminal background and receive training in one of these three technical skills, along with employment services, resume building, math comprehension, life skills training and more, all at no cost to them. Students leave our campuses with not only training to find employment in their respective fields, but also a team of support behind them as they find jobs, build careers and begin to rebuild their lives.


